Carol Luecht, 86, of Sheffield, passed away Saturday, September 28, 2024, at the Sheffield Care Center. A Celebration of her life will be held 2:00 p.m., Saturday, October 12 at Zion St. John Lutheran Church, Sheffield, with Rev. G Kim Wills presiding. Interment will be at Hillside Cemetery, Sheffield. Carol M. Luecht was born October 18, 1937, at Devil's Lake, ND, a daughter of Arnold and Margaret (Kirkeby) Arneson. The family moved to Joice, Iowa where she graduated Joice High School with the class of 1955.
