Charlotte Mae Meyer, 91, of Grundy Center and formerly of the Wellsburg and Iowa Falls area, passed away Thursday, September 17, 2015 at the Grundy Memorial Hospital Long Term Care Unit, under the care of Care Initiatives Hospice.
