Dean Miller, 87, of Hampton, passed away Monday, October 7, 2024, at MercyOne North Iowa Medical Center in Mason City. A Celebration of Life memorial visitation will be held from 4:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m., Friday, October 11, 2024, at Woodley Funeral Home in Hampton. A private family burial will take place in the Hampton Cemetery. Woodley Funeral Home of Hampton is caring for Dean and his family.

Dean Ira Miller was born October 12, 1936, in Franklin County, Iowa, son of Ira and Mabel (Patton) Miller. He graduated from Hampton High School and then enlisted in the United States Navy.
