Elaine Barsness, 95, of Iowa Falls, passed away Thursday, August 22, 2019 at Scenic Manor. Memorial mass will be 11:00 AM Friday, September 6, 2019 at the St. Mark Catholic Church in Iowa Falls. Visitation will be from 9:30 AM until service time on Friday at the church. She will be laid to rest with a graveside service at 11:00 AM on Saturday, September 7, 2019 at the Salem Memorial Cemetery in Lake Mills, Iowa. Elaine "Lannie" (Hebel) Barsness was born on April 19, 1924 on a farm near Kiester, Minnesota to Ferdinand and Helen (Yezek) Hebel. She was the second youngest of ten children. Lannie graduated from high school at Holy Family School in Mason City, Iowa. She went on to attend and graduate from Hamilton School of Commerce in Mason City. On July 2, 1949 Lannie was united in marriage to Norman Barsness in Manly, Iowa.

Following moves from Mason City to Fremont, Nebraska and Waterloo, Iowa, Lannie, Norm and family found their way to Lake Mills, Iowa. After a few years of being a "stay at home mom" Lannie went back to work as a legal secretary at the Sarno Law Firm in Lake Mills. She remained at the law firm until her retirement in 1986.

After retirement, Lannie enjoyed quilting, crocheting and making pillowcase

dolls from a pattern she designed herself. She was active at the St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Lake Mills. She served as a lector and communion minister as well as on various church committees. Lannie enjoyed playing Bridge with her friends. She loved having them at her home or meeting them at Rice Lake Country Club in Lake Mills. In addition to Bridge, Lannie's noon hour gin rummy games with Norm were epic and often ended with Norm on the losing end, although he never liked to admit it. She lived in Lake Mills for forty-five years and loved her time there. In 2008 Lannie moved to Scenic Living Communities in Iowa Falls where she enjoyed many more years of happiness with new friends and family.

Elaine Barsness is survived by her son, Jim (Kathy) Barsness of Iowa Falls, Iowa; her daughter, Mary Jo (Marty) Purdham of Tucson, Arizona; grandchildren: Lindsay (Nick) Pingel, Erin (Brent) Gangestad, Scott (Amy) Barsness, Megan (Jason) Feiferluck and Gale (Jared) Deskin; great grandchildren: Ella, Brody, Heidi, Michael, Liam and Henry.
