They moved to a farm Southeast of Allison and farmed and lived there for 45 years. Then they moved to Parkersburg and lived there until Fannie lost her house in the 2008 tornado. Fannie faithfully worshipped at the Gospel Hall rural Aplington until she moved into the Rehabilitation Center. Fannie loved to play the accordion and sing with her husband, and daughters. Fannie is survived by two daughters Alma Kampman of Allison and Anna Mae Hahn of Cedar Falls. Four grandchildren, 6 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren.
