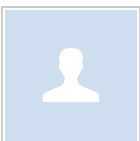

I remember the day he got his first electric wheelchair. A man brought it to school to see if it fit and to give Hayden a chance to practice in the hallways, etc. He was ecstatic! He laughed and laughed. He wanted to go FAST and had to be chased to change the speed to turtle instead of rabbit and lock it at that speed. He definitely preferred FAST! He was just so happy that day!❤️. He will be missed so much.
