She took great joy in gardening, canning peaches, baking cookies and bars, and making

Helen enjoyed making patchwork quilts, sewing one for each grandchild, and eagerly anticipated the yearly fishing trips at Big Balsam Camp. These gatherings brought the entire family together for a week of fellowship, love, and the celebration of her birthday.
