In her younger years Jessie was employed as a carhop, waitress, and factory worker. She retired from Farmland Foods after 20some years and then got her GED, and got her CNA. She worked at Ellsworth Hospital and retired from there as well.

While Jessie held many positions in her lifetime, her favorite was mom and grandma. She not only loved her husband, her children and grandchildren but all her friends, neighbors and babies, she loved all babies, babies were beautiful, especially hers. Jessie had six children whom she loved

unconditionally. Jessie's children remember her as a wonderful mother who was understanding and a kind and patient teacher. She did not seem surprised by much and was always understanding, yet still a strict disciplinarian. She said what she meant, and meant what she said.

Jessie loved crocheting, gardening, and canning. Everyone always complimented her on what a fantastic cook she was. Even after her diagnosis of macular degeneration she still cooked, crocheted, bowled, still did everything except read books and drive. It never slowed her down.

Early in her marriage to Dorlin, they enjoyed riding motorcycles, camping, having barbeques, and square dancing. Jessie and Dorlin rode their motorcycles with Dorlin's brother Kenny and his wife Eva across the United States. Jessie was loved by many and will be greatly missed by all who knew her. She was able to spend her final weeks at home under the care of her daughter Sadie (Marci). Those last few weeks were special to her family, and they were grateful to have the time with her.
