



Orah Affabelle Cook Greenfield

July 29, 1917 - June 5, 2011

Orah Affabelle Cook Greenfield of Franklin General Hospital Nursing Facility passed away Sunday June 5, 2011. She was 93. Orah was born in Nashua, Iowa on July 29, 1917 to Claude and Blanche (Carey) Cook. The family lived on a farm near the Little Brown Church in the Vale where they were members. Later she attended Hamilton School of Business and taught country school in Chickasaw and Floyd counties until her marriage in 1939 to Morris Greenfield of Ackley, Iowa. In 1943 the family came to Hampton and established the Greenfield Funeral Home. They moved to Webster City in 1963 and were in the funeral business for ten years before retiring in Hampton. Most recently Orah was living in Osage Beach, MO before moving back to Hampton in 2003. Besides being a partner in the funeral business, Orah was active in the Congregational Church, Mothers Club, Eastern Star and several bridge clubs. She liked to dance and sing and was an excellent homemaker. She did volunteer work and loved to read. She will be remembered for her positive attitude and friendly personality. She is survived by her daughter, Judith Clark (Jerry) of Iowa City, three grandchildren, Cynthia Clark of Iowa City, Matthew (Amanda) Brandt and their 2 children Arabelle and Bairron of Springfield, MO., and Patrick (Whitney) Brandt of Orlando, FL., a sister-in-law Mildred Cook of Waterloo and seven nieces and nephews and their children. She was preceded in death by her parents, husband Morris Greenfield, two daughters Patricia Greenfield and Rhonda Brandt, two sisters Ethelyn McFarland and Ednah Clouse and two brothers, Lyle and Harland Cook.
