Shirley M. Knudsen was called home to her Heavenly Father on Tuesday, November 17, 2015, at Franklin Country View Nursing Facility in Hampton, Iowa. Shirley May (Foster) Knudsen was born on May 7, 1936, on the family farm north of Latimer, the daughter of Frank and Esther (Nielsen) Foster. She was baptized on June 7, 1936, and confirmed in May of 1950, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Thornton. Shirley attended Prairie Side #9 (rural Latimer), Thornton Public School, and Franklin Consolidated (now CAL), from which she graduated in 1954. She then earned her B.A. Degree from Iowa State Teachers College (now UNI) in Cedar Falls. On November 10, 1961, she married Bryan H. (Ace) Knudsen at Nazareth Lutheran Church in Coulter. Their children are Bryce Allen Knudsen and Sheryl Marie Knudsen-Pringle. Children were always a focal point of Shirley's life from her own children and grandchildren to children of her church and community. She taught Sunday School and Vacation Bible School for over 20 years, as well as holding several offices on Nazareth Church Council and Nazareth ELCW. Shirley taught the children of the communities of Marshalltown (3 years), Hampton (South Side 4 years), and CAL for 24 years. After retiring she joined Big Brothers/Big Sisters and mentored two girls, Alyssa and McKayla for several years. Being active in her community, Shirley was instrumental in establishing the Coulter Public Library and was co-author of the Coulter History Book.
